STORY: Sgt. James (Jim) Giczi was a 28-year veteran of the RCMP. He began his career with a posting in Regina, Saskatchewan, followed by postings in Coquitlam and Fort Nelson, BC. Jim spent the last 17 years of his career serving the Yukon as a Forensic Identification Specialist.

Sgt. Giczi's career was well decorated. During his career, he had an emergency disinfection kit named after him, received a Commanding Officer's Award, and the RCMP Commissioner's Award. In 2015 he was awarded the Governor General's Meritorious Service Medal for his work on a tire pattern data base which he created.

A father of two boys, Sgt. Giczi was an active member of every community he lived in. During his time in Whitehorse, Jim was an active member of the Oldtimer's Hockey League, played Slo-Pitch, coached minor hockey, and was on the Volleyball Yukon board. Sgt. Giczi loved to share what he did for a living, giving presentations to countless high school classes participating in the PARTY program, and presenting to other agencies in the territory.
