She was a highly respected participant at all tables, strong but gentle, caring, and encouraging. She was honest and always did what she thought was right for the greater good. Edna was incredibly accomplished despite lacking a formal education, and as such, was an advocate for the values of educating youth. Edna has encouraged the generations that follow her to pursue cultural knowledge, traditional pursuits, and higher education.
