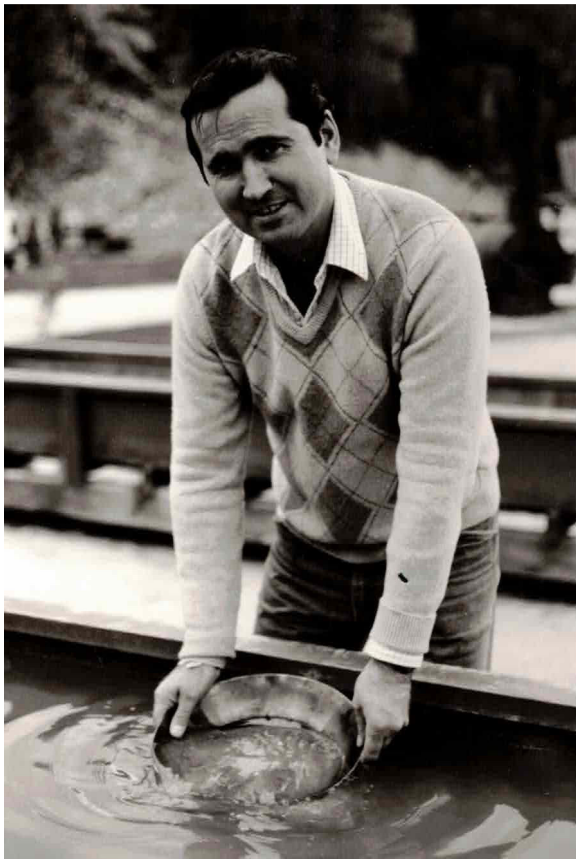


PETER JENKINS



STORY: Peter Jenkins moved to the Yukon in 1969 and settled in Dawson City in 1972. He commenced a political career spanning over three decades, making him one of the Yukon's longest-serving politicians.

He first served as Mayor of Dawson from 1980 to 1994 before entering territorial politics in 1996 where he acted as Deputy Premier and as Minister for portfolios such as environment and health. He then returned to municipal politics, serving again as Mayor of Dawson from 2009 to 2012.



Peter was both a heavy duty and automotive mechanic by trade, owned and operated the Eldorado Hotel, and was involved in many community organizations. He was a formidable spirit who was quietly generous. He valued the power of education, and he loved the community of Dawson.
